


# GALILEO'S PENDULUM by Michael Megliola

Galileo never did most of the things for which many people give him credit. He did not drop stones off the leaning tower of Pisa or invent the telescope. By the time Galileo came along, people had also discovered, forgotten, then rediscovered that the

earth orbits the sun. Galileo, however, did something much more important, courageous, and dangerous than any of those things — he stood up for the freedom of thought. He demanded that academic, religious and political leaders accept scientific methods. He dared to challenge censorship at a time when people who spoke out were sometimes tortured or killed. Galileo was forced to recant his beliefs, at least publicly, but by then the truth was out. This script was written for children to perform for young audiences 7 and older, but it is possible that adults or teens could perform for young audiences, as well.

This tale follows three American children, Liz, Robin & Jenny, on vacation in England, who accidentally spend the night in an old castle. There they encounter

King Arthur and his Candlemas Court filled with legendary characters that meet once a year to discuss important matters of state with other great and noble ones from in and out of their time: Gwenevere, William Shakespeare, Queen Elizabeth, Robin Hood & Maid Marion, Queen Boudicca, Lady Bettris, and Burd Janet. The real story here is that of the modern children, who through this magical interaction, are able to come to a greater understanding of the importance of history, ideas, truth and honor. Since the play deals with ancient stories, there is mature subject matter that is presented as a part of the stories of Arthur and of Boudicca. Mature students would be the best audience, maybe 6th Grade or older, but especially Junior High and High School students, as the characters of the children fall into this age-group.

# WELL-BEHAVED WOMEN

by Jes Marbacher

From the Seneca Falls Convention in 1848, and the launch of the women's right's movement, women

worked tirelessly for their right to vote. After 72 long years the 19th Amendment was passed, and women were legally allowed to cast their ballots for the first time in the 1920 election. This movement spans decades and involves many women. Playwright Jes Marbacher deftly crafts a work in two Acts, the first focusing in on Susan B. Anthony's attempt to vote and subsequent arrest in 1872, and the second on Alice Paul and the suffragettes of the 1910's. Women's suffrage was a complex issue for a lot of people and students of today have a hard time wrapping their heads around why. Even more difficult to understand is why many of these issues still exist today. That is the perfect reason to produce this play, to remind people that these issues are still not fully taken care of.

Genevieve Aichele, founding artistic director of NHTP, is a resident of Portsmouth, NH, and received her degree in Music & Theatre from the University of New Hampshire in 1975, graduating summa cum laude. Genevieve has directed professional and student performers in a variety of theatrical venues throughout New England.

Recent acting credits include Dorothea in Eleemosynary, Gracie in Faith Healer, Sister Aloysius in Doubt, and a vocalist in Jacques Brel at NHTP, Sister Esther in A Shaker Entertainment at Shaker Village in Canterbury, and her original one-woman show Resurrection for Act One

Genevieve has written hundreds of playscripts for young people, represented by Leicester Bay Theatricals, as well as an original musical adaptation of Aristophanes' Lysistrata, the oral history play *Neighborhoods*, for which she received the 2001 Spotlight Community Arts Award, and *Dreaming Again*, a docu-drama about immigration in New Hampshire commissioned by the NH Humanities Council. Her first novel for young readers, *Ocean Secrets* with co-author Tracy Kane, was published in 2015.

In 2001 Genevieve received the prestigious New Hampshire Governors Award for Excellence in Arts in Education and the Portsmouth Spotlight Award for her work in Community Arts. In 2002, she received an award for Outstanding Achievement in American Theatre from the New England Theatre Conference, and in 2008, she received the NH Theatre Award for Youth Theatre.



**Jes Marbacher** is a writing and communications professional and freelance theater artist working in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. She first came to NHTP through an artists in residence program more than 15 years ago. Jes performed with New Hampshire Theatre Project's Youth Repertory Company for many years and served as a technical intern before earning a degree in English from Colgate University in 2013. Following graduation, Jes returned to the seacoast and to NHTP. In addition to her work with New Hampshire Theatre Project, Jes now works in market research and moonlights as a stand-up comedian. Her original script about the women's suffragist movement, Well-Behaved Women, written for NHTP's Junior Repertory Company, premiered in April 2016.



**Michael Megliola** has spent many years contributing to progressive theater for young actors. All three of his sons appeared on stage with New Hampshire Theatre Project in Portsmouth, NH. The youngest, Leo, inspired him to write for that stage. Michael's goal is to stress technique, support an ensemble cast, and make material accessible to young actors without diluting its message.



**Meghann Beauchamp** is a Michigan native who received her bachelor's degree in Theatre & Dance from Ohio Wesleyan University, graduating summa cum laude. A performer, technical director and designer, Meghann relishes the variety and creativity of life in the theatre. Created in 1999, the NHTP Youth Repertory Company is designed for passionate, gifted students who want to experience a professional theatrical community in a conservatory-style program. Repertory Company alumni have stressed that participation in this program was an **important factor in their college acceptances**. Alumni also praise the Youth Repertory program for teaching them leadership, public speaking, teamwork, critical thinking, confidence, and problem-solving skills. By senior year, participants will have completed all K-12 curriculum requirements for drama in the national education standards. Many students work with their high school **Extended Learning Opportunities** programs to receive academic credit for participation.
